- Assess the tenure governance system against the needs of the community/practice

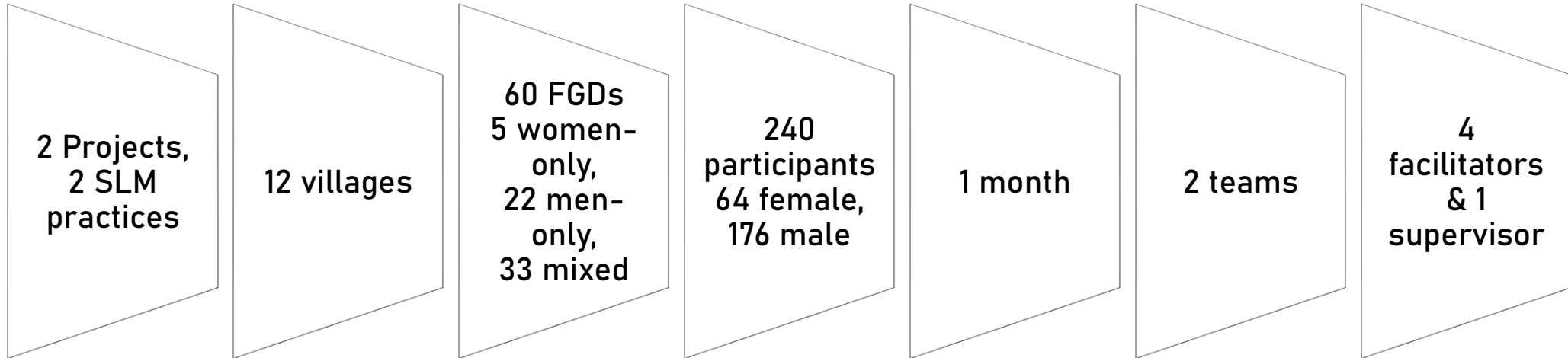


Why a Land tenure for SLM Module?

- Support communities in prioritizing tenure actions for SLM activities

The Madagascar Pilot



Outcome

- ✓ Tenure security is important as an enabling environment but is not enough to leverage an upscaling process of SLM in the context of LDN
- ✓ Challenges related to policy, coordination, and capacity



Additional studies

- Analysis of farmers production system (571 household surveys)
- Identifying other barriers / enabling environment
 - Labor saturation (workload)
 - Technologies access (extension services + inputs availability)
 - Market proximity
 - Social acceptability
